**The Regents Diploma with Advanced Designation requires all listed plus 2 additional credits of LOTE, 2 additional Regents exams in mathematics, an additional Regents exam in science, and a locally developed exam in LOTE.*

In order to graduate from Seton Catholic Central, each student is required to complete courses and exams mandated by the Board of Regents of the State of New York as well as additional requirements in Theology. Each student graduating from Seton must acquire a minimum of 24 units of credit. In keeping with the educational objectives of SCC, each student is required to carry a minimum of seven units of credit each year, including at least eight courses each semester. Each student is expected to be involved in service to the school, fellow students, and the community.

Grade Point Average

Seton Catholic Central students are graded on a percentage scale of 0-100. The passing grade is 65. Grades received through the junior year and the summer preceding the senior year are used as a basis for computing the grade point average. The weighting system described in this section is applied when determining a student's grade point average and class rank. The final grade point average is determined by adding all of the grades (non-weighted and weighted) and dividing by the total number of credits.

Weighting System

Final course grades appear *unweighted* on the student transcript. All courses are included in the overall GPA except Physical Education.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT TEST DATA

- In the 2015-2016 school year, 91 Seton Catholic Central students in grades 10-12 took 205 AP exams in 16 subject areas
 - 68% of the scores were 3 and above
 - 31% of the scores were 4 and above
 - AP Examinations are mandatory in each AP course
- In 2016, SCC had 25 AP Scholars, 4 AP Scholars with Honors, and 9 AP Scholars with Distinction.**
