**Enrollment Process 2013-14** - The enrollment process is open for the 2013-14 school year. Within the next week families will be receiving a packet of information that contains (a) an application, (b) SMART Tuition materials and (3) tuition rates. We are requesting that application materials be completed and returned by March 27. No deposit is required for applications submitted by that date. Financial aid applications are available at Seton. The deadline for completing those applications is March 15. All admission applications submitted by March 15 will be entered into a drawing for a 50% tuition waiver. There will be one waiver for elementary grades (K-6) and one waiver for secondary grades (7-12). Any questions, please contact Rich Bucci @ 723-5307.

**Safety Update** - On January 31 members of the Binghamton Police Department’s SWAT Team and I conducted a safety audit of our campus. We evaluated the security of our building and reviewed our procedures for responding to different emergency situations. As a result we are making improvements to our building and will be updating our emergency response procedures. The review and evaluation is an on-going process.

**Report Cards** - Report cards will be distributed on Wednesday, February 6.

**Ash Wednesday** - Students and faculty will begin the Lenten Season with Mass @ 1:45 p.m. on Wednesday, February 13. Parents are welcome to attend.

**Seton’s Science Olympiad Team** - Seton’s Science Olympiad Team made up of students from grades 7-9 participated in a Science Olympiad Invitational in West Chester, Pennsylvania on January 27. The competition involved top ranked teams from both New York and Pennsylvania. The team placed 5<sup>th</sup> out of 31 participating teams which is an impressive performance. The team received 5 top medals in 5 events and ranked in the top 10 in 12 out of 24 events. The team will be competing in a regional competition at Maine Endwell Middle School on February 23.

**Uniform Policy** - The way our students look defines who we are as a school community. Students in Catholic schools throughout the nation wear uniforms. It is a long standing tradition that promotes equality among students and creates an atmosphere that facilitates scholarship. After a careful review of the current dress code recommendations were made and accepted to enhance it. Those changes were highlighted in the January newsletter and are more thoroughly outlined in the attached uniform policy for 2013-14.

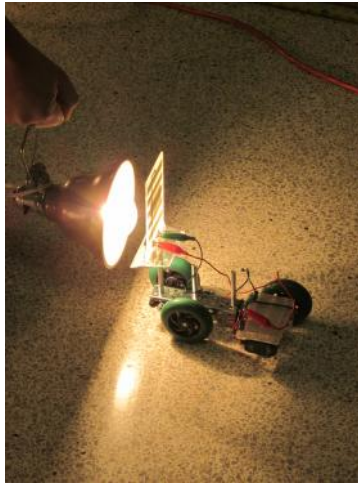

**Hudson Valley First Tech Challenge Championship** - Seton Catholic Central's Robotics Team participated in this competition which took place at PACE University on Long Island on January 27. Seton was one of 36 from throughout the northeast. This was Seton's first appearance and they placed 29 out of 36 teams. The team impressed judges with their creativity and enthusiasm. Any student who participated in this competition is automatically eligible for a First Robotics Scholarship at participating universities.

**Relay for Life** - One of the major fundraisers of the American Cancer Society is the Relay for Life. It is a 12-hour event in which teams are involved in continuous laps of a field or other facility. Teams raise funds which are targeted for the Cancer Society's research and educational programs. The Seton Catholic Central student body will be hosting a Relay for Life at the high school campus on Friday, May 17 and Saturday, May 18. Seton is the first high school in southern and central New York to host a relay. Our students are enthusiastically engaged in the process which underscores their commitment to community service.

**Math Support for 7<sup>th</sup> & 8<sup>th</sup> Grade Students** - through the efforts of our Special Education teacher Elizabeth Ampula we have formed a partnership with Binghamton University to assist our students in the area of mathematics. Jessica Winkle, an education student at Binghamton University, will be available after school on Thursdays from 3:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. to work with 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students on math skills. The first session will be on Thursday, February 7 in room 107. The program is open to all students. 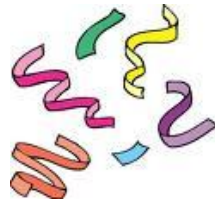
## Senior Class Bottle Drive News

# SCC UNIFORM DRESS CODE FOR ALL STUDENTS FOR 2013 – 2014

## Dress Code Modifications

### GRADES 7 - 8

**Boys and girls** will be **required to wear** Seton green, black or white polo shirts purchased from Flynn and O'Hara. Sweaters and fleeces are optional. However, if students choose to wear a sweater or fleece, it **must** have the Seton logo and **must** be purchased from Flynn and O'Hara.

**Boys** will have the option to wear a shirt and tie. **Girls** may wear the Seton blouse and plaid skirt purchased from Flynn and O'Hara throughout the year.

### GRADES 9 - 12

**Boys** will be **required** to wear a white shirt and tie. Seton green, black or white polo shirts purchased from Flynn and O'Hara will be **optional** in the months of September and June. Seton logo sweaters and fleeces purchased from Flynn and O'Hara will still be allowed. There is no change in uniform requirements regarding pants.

**Girls** will be **required** to wear a Seton logo blouse purchased from Flynn and O'Hara. As with the boys, Seton green, black or white polo shirts purchased from Flynn and O'Hara will be optional in the months of September and June. Seton logo sweaters and fleeces will still be allowed. There is no change in uniform requirements regarding pants and skirts.

## SCC UNIFORM DRESS CODE FOR ALL STUDENTS

### Grades 9 – 12

#### **GIRLS – Mandatory**

Girls **must** purchase a green plaid skirt and a white blouse with a Seton logo from the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company. ***The skirt must be hemmed to an appropriate length – no higher than 2" above the top of the knee cap when standing straight.*** This uniform may be worn every day, but must be worn on specified occasions, such as Mass days. The blouse must remain fully buttoned and tucked in at all times.

Dress shoes **must** be worn with socks, hunter green or black tights or light colored stockings. ***Leggings and other colored tights are NOT acceptable.*** The following are **NOT** considered dress shoes and therefore are **NOT** acceptable: boots (or any shoes that are above the ankle), clogs (or any open-back shoes), crocs (or any look-alikes), ballet or other slipper-like shoes, shoes with excessively high heels (over 2"), shoes with fur or made out of fabric or canvas, open-toed shoes, sandals, athletic look-alikes, sneakers, slides, or flip flops. When in doubt, ask before wearing to school.

#### **Options**

Girls may choose to wear dress black or khaki slacks with a belt every day instead of the plaid skirt. However, these pants **must** be purchased from the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company. ***Yoga pants and tight pants are NOT acceptable.*** Girls' slacks **must** be the ***same style and fit*** as those purchased through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company. The slacks may not have external pockets or rivets; this means that the slacks may **not** look like jeans. Hunter green or black sweaters or vests with the Seton logo are an option but **must** be purchased from the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company. In addition, the sweaters and/or vests **must** be worn with the white blouse. In addition, hunter green or black fleece jackets with the Seton logo purchased through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company may be worn with the white Seton blouse.



## **BOYS – Mandatory**

The boys' uniform dress code consists of dress black or khaki slacks with a belt, a white dress shirt that must remain fully buttoned and tucked in at all times and a tie of choice – all of which may be purchased at local stores. These items are also available through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company. The slacks may **not** have external pockets or rivets; this means that the slacks may **not** look like jeans or cargo-style pants.

Dress shoes **must** be worn with socks. The following are **not** considered dress shoes and therefore are **not acceptable**: boots of any kind, athletic look-alikes, sneakers, slides, flip flops, clogs, crocs, sandals, canvas shoes or open toed shoes.

### **Options**

Hunter green or black sweaters or vests with the Seton logo are an option, but **must** be purchased from the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company. In addition, the sweaters and/or vests **must** be worn with the white shirt and tie. In addition, as an option, hunter green or black fleece jackets with the Seton logo purchased through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company may be worn with the white shirt and tie.

## **BOTH BOYS AND GIRLS**

Seton athletic sports team shirts may be worn **only** when the team is in season and **only** on game days. These shirts **must** have collars and sleeves and must also be fully tucked in at all times during the school day to be in dress code. Team apparel will be approved by the Administration and **must** be consistent with Seton dress code. Wearing long-sleeved shirts under short-sleeved shirts is **not** acceptable.

## **Grades 7 - 8**

### **GIRLS**

Black or khaki pants or walking shorts will be available for purchase through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company; these items may be purchased at local stores so long as the style and fit are consistent with those provided by the uniform company. Leggings, yoga pants and tight pants/shorts are **not acceptable**.

Hunter green, black or white long- or short-sleeved Seton polo shirts and hunter green or black sweaters or vests **must** be purchased through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company. Hunter green or black fleece jackets may be worn **only** if purchased through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company; these jackets **must** have the Seton logo. Blouses **must** be fully tucked in at all times.

### **BOYS**

Black or khaki pants or walking shorts may be purchased at local stores and will also be available for purchase through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company.

Hunter green, black or white long- or short-sleeved Seton polo shirts and hunter green or black Seton sweaters or Seton vests **must** be purchased through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company. Hunter green or black Seton fleece jackets may be worn **only** if purchased through the Flynn and O'Hara Uniform Company; these jackets **must** have the Seton logo. Shirts **must** be fully tucked in at all times.

## **BOTH BOYS AND GIRLS**

Girls and boys in grades 7 and 8 may wear sneakers or other rubber-soled shoes. All students **must** wear socks of some kind. White, black or hunter green socks, tights or light colored stockings may be worn. Socks or tights of any other color are **not** acceptable. Wearing long-sleeved shirts under short-sleeved shirts is **not** acceptable.

Boys and girls will change for PE classes in the locker rooms. There is no PE uniform. Students should bring sweatpants or shorts, T-shirts and/or sweatshirts, sneakers and socks. Please make sure that the clothing fits properly, is modest and does not have inappropriate language, images or advertising.
