Cornell Biologist To Work With Seton Catholic Central Students - Mike D. Yerky, PhD, the outreach coordinator for the Cornell Institute for Biology Teachers (CIBT), will be spending the day at Seton Catholic Central on Thursday, November 8 working with the AP Biology students on DNA Profiling. They will investigate the technology behind DNA Profiling (DNA fingerprinting). The students will cut DNA with restriction enzymes, the DNA fragments will be separated electrophoretically on an agarose gel and the results will simulate a DNA profile. Students will gain knowledge in biotechnology techniques during this day long investigation.

Student Assistance Program Continues at Seton - Seton is continuing to host the Student Assistance Program offered through Lourdes Hospital. The program provides alcohol, tobacco and other drug prevention counseling and education services to our students. This program is also for the early identification of students who are experiencing problems in school. Jackie Steckler has returned as the Student Assistance Counselor. She has experience in working with adolescents, and has specialized training in prevention and early intervention strategies with students. Mrs. Steckler is also available for parent meetings as requested. She can answer parents' questions, provide education, and provide referral to additional services as needed. All services are free, voluntary and confidential.

Junior Class Visits Historic Exhibit at Roberson - On Friday, November 2, Seton's junior class walked to the Roberson Museum and Science Center and viewed a historic Civil War exhibition. The focal points of the exhibit were two documents of historic significance. The documents in this exhibition were the Preliminary Emancipation Proclamation written by President Abraham Lincoln and issued on September 22, 1862, and the Centennial Address written by Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr. 100 years later. Roberson was one of only eight sites throughout the state to host this exhibit. This was a unique opportunity for our students.

Cornell University PhD Student Visits 7th Grade Science Classes - On Thursday, October 25, Jason Boock, a PhD student in the Chemical and Biomolecular Engineering Department at Cornell University visited Kristen Blabac's 7th grade classes. Together they taught students to think critically about what it means to be alive. Students made observations of various objects and decided if those objects are living, or not, based on the characteristics of life they believe to be inherent to all living things. Students looked at, among other things, genetically engineered E. coli. These bacteria have been genetically engineered to glow green when viewed under black light. This is due to a protein, Green Fluorescent Protein (GFP) that was isolated and transformed into the E. coli cells to be used as an expression factor. Students viewed the GFP E. coli along with a glow stick and determined which one is living. This allowed students to use critical thinking skills and served as an inquiry activity into what it truly means to be alive. As a follow up to the activity, students shared their ideas and were asked to defend their positions. The exposure to a scientist from Cornell increased student interest in science as a future career.

Jan De Angelo Recognized for Artistic Achievement - Mr. Jan De Angelo, an instructor and artistic director at Seton Catholic Central, is the recipient of the Broome County Arts Council's 2012 Heart of the Arts and Lifetime Achievement Award. In addition to his position at Seton, Jan is a choreographer, director, pianist, accompanist, composer and singer. Jan is being recognized for the diverse and significant contributions he has made to the cultural life of southern and central New York. The Seton community extends its congratulations as Jan receives this prestigious honor.

Seton Cross Country Team Excels - The Seton Catholic Central Cross Country Team continued its proud tradition with a strong finish to the regular season. At the STAC meet on October 27, Nicole Blazicek and Jamie Farrell earned All-STAC honors, and at the coaches' meeting afterwards, Sam Breese was chosen All-Central Division.

On November 1, All Saints' Day, Nicole Blazicek and Jamie Farrell ran very well, finishing 5th and 6th in Section IV, Class D, earning the right to compete at the State Cross Country Meet to be held on Saturday, November 10 at Elma Meadows, NY.

Boys and Girls Soccer Programs Make Their Mark - Both the boys and girls soccer teams had exceptional seasons. The boys reached the Class C sectional semi-final game and the girls reached the Class B sectional final game. Both teams played with enthusiasm and a competitive spirit that impressed their fans and opponents alike.

Saints Girls Varsity Tennis Team Wins Sectional Title - The Saints Girls Varsity Tennis team won the Class B Sectional Title on Monday, October 15 in Owego. This is the Saints third sectional title in 4 years. The Saints won with 41 team points, Susquehanna Valley was second with 36.

Representing the Saints in Sectional play were Abigail Galyon, Maya Haykal, Katherine Loughlin, Samantha Koulikas, Lauren Miller, Lauren Crowley and Isabella Aswad. Abigail Galyon finished second in singles play and Katherine Loughlin and Samantha Koulikas finished third in doubles and will advance to the NYSPHSAA Section 4 Qualifier at the Binghamton Tennis Center on Friday, October 26. The sectional team title came after a completing a winning season with a team record of 15-2.



We Are Reinforcing Our Commitment to Good Nutrition -Beginning this school year Seton is putting in place some new USDA guidelines for even healthier meals for our students. We'll be reminding students that they now must choose at least one fruit or one vegetable among the three meal components they need to take for a complete lunch.

The following are the major changes for this year: Previously, students didn't have to take a fruit or vegetable at all as long as they took enough other items. Now they must choose at least one fruit or vegetable serving, and we encourage them to choose both if they'd like.

Students will have a greater selection of fruits and vegetables to choose from. We will be offering one cup of vegetables and one cup of fruit per day. We'll be emphasizing the healthiest vegetables more often, with weekly offerings of healthy dark green and red/orange vegetables as well as beans and legumes. Whole grains are up. Beginning this year at least 51% of all grain foods we serve will be whole-grain rich with some being 100% whole wheat. Bad fats are down.

Meals will average less than 10% calories from saturated fat and every item will contain zero grams per serving of trans fat. We will be serving only fat free white milk, 1% white milk and fat free chocolate milk. We will be meeting new standards for limiting sodium until we reach a final maximum of 740 mg sodium per meal on an average.


