**Middle States Re-accreditation** - Seton Catholic Central has been accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Schools since 1993. We were re-accredited in 2003. Our second re-accreditation process was extended from 2010 to enable our transition into a new grade 7 through 12 school. And now we are embarking on an accreditation process that encompasses our entire Diocese, one that ensures our re-accreditation as an individual school in the process.
