Grade Point Average

Seton Catholic Central students are graded on a percentage scale of 0-100. High school courses taken in grade 8 and beyond are included in the GPA computation. Grades received through the junior year and the summer preceding the senior year are used as a basis for computing the GPA. The weighting system described in this section is applied when determining a student's GPA. The weighted grade is computed by multiplying the earned grade by the GPA factor. The final grade point average is determined by adding all of the grades (non-weighted and weighted) and dividing by the total number of credits.

Rank

Seton Catholic Central does not report class rank.

Weighting System

Final course grades appear *unweighted* on the student transcript. Course grades are weighted accordingly only in the cumulative average. Through the 2016-17 school year, all courses are included in the overall GPA except Physical Education. Beginning with the 2017-18 school year, Physical Education will be included in the overall GPA. Both the weighted and unweighted GPAs are available.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT TEST DATA

- In the 2016-2017 school year, 95 Seton Catholic Central students in grades 10-12 took 206 AP exams in 19 subject areas
- 74.3% of the scores were 3 and above
- 43.2% of the scores were 4 and above

In 2017, SCC had 14 AP Scholars, 8 AP Scholars with Honors, 13 AP Scholars with Distinction and 3 National AP Scholars.
